Department of Mathematics, University of Tsukuba in Japan is now actively recruiting a professor.

1. Number of Positions: One full professor (tenured).
Department: Department of Mathematics.
2. Research Field: Algebra.
3. Qualifications: (i) Doctoral degree / Ph.D.
(ii) Sufficient Japanese language proficiency to conduct classes and meetings in Japanese.
4. Duties: (i) Teaching mathematics (lectures, exercise classes and seminars for undergraduate and graduate schools).
(ii) Providing service (management and operation) to the department and university.
Starting Date: Not before April 1st, 2027 and as soon as possible when available.
5. Application Materials: Applicants are requested to submit the following documents by registered mail.
 - 1) Curriculum Vitae.
 - 2) List of research achievements
(with acceptance letters for accepted preprints).
 - 3) Reprints of up to five major papers published or accepted within the past five years (since 2021). Photocopies are acceptable.
 - 4) Summary of your previous research and your future research plan
(2 pages on A4 size paper).
 - 5) Aspirations for mathematics education at University of Tsukuba
(1 page on A4 size paper).
 - 6) Names and postal/e-mail addresses of two or three researchers who are available for consultation.
 - 7) List of the research funds obtained in the past.
 - 8) Contact address of applicant (affiliation, address, telephone number, e-mail address, etc.).
 - 9) Self-Declaration on Specific Categories.

8. Selection Process

Applicants will be screened based on their submitted documents, and interviews will be conducted.

Please note that travel expenses for the interview will not be reimbursed.

9. Annual salary: between 9,000,000 and 11,000,000 JPY.

Salary will be determined in accordance with university regulations, based on the candidate’s academic and professional background.

Allowances (e.g., commuting and housing) will be provided according to university regulations.

10. Benefits

Enrollment in the Mutual Aid Association for National Public Service Personnel Eligibility for employment insurance and workers’ accident compensation insurance.

Overtime work may be required (e.g., for entrance examinations, university-wide events, and other temporary duties).

No probationary period.

11. Working Days

Five days a week (Monday to Friday), under the discretionary labor system for

professional work.

Deemed working hours: 7 hours and 45 minutes per day.

Saturdays, Sundays, national holidays, and the year-end/New Year holidays (December 29 to January 3) are non-working days.

12. Paid Leave

Annual paid leave is available.

Other types of leave are provided in accordance with university employment regulations.

13. Notes

- University of Tsukuba selects personnel in accordance with the principles and policies of “University of Tsukuba Basic Principles and Basic Plan for Diversity.”
